SPECIAL CONDITIONS

- A. For series streetlighting systems, the District will furnish the constant current regulating transformers.
- B. Service shall generally be from dusk to dawn and will be considered as 4,190 hours per year or 349 hours per month.
- C. All plans and specifications for the installation of, and the construction of, lighting systems shall be subject to approval of the District, and the District shall have the right to inspect and test the installations before accepting for service. Where service is furnished from overhead lines, the District may, at its option, install the overhead interconnecting circuits between electrolier posts.
- D. Regulations Governing the Sale of Electric Energy: Service under this rate schedule is subject to the District's Regulations Governing the Sale of Electric Energy.
