APPLICABILITY

Applicable to service to state highway lighting installations where the customer owns and maintains the equipment and the District furnishes energy at one or more central points in accordance with special conditions set forth herein.

Energy Cost Adjustment:

The kilowatt-hours, as determined above, are subject to an energy cost adjustment as provided in Schedule ECA and ECA-R.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

- A. Service shall generally be from dusk to dawn and will be considered as 4,190 hours per year or 349 hours per month.

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- B. All plans and specifications for the installation of, and the construction of, lighting systems shall be subject to approval by the District, and the District shall have the right to inspect and test the installations before accepting for service. Where service is furnished from overhead lines, the District may, at its option, install the overhead interconnecting circuits between poles.
- C. Customers shall install, own and maintain all facilities beyond the service delivery point. The customer is responsible for all installation costs associated with the street light installation, as well as ongoing maintenance and replacement service when it has been determined that such replacement is necessary.
- D. For an underground service installation, the customer will be required to furnish and install the necessary underground wiring, ducts for service, pullboxes, conduits, substructures including foundations and anchor bolts, excavating, backfilling, and restoration of the pavement in accordance with the District's specifications. Any installations over the above standard provisions may be installed by agreement between the parties provided the customer pays all incurred costs. All underground maintenance, foundations and steel poles installation costs are the responsibility of the customer.
- E. The District shall furnish and install the underground and overhead service conductor, transformers and necessary facilities to complete the service to the line side of the customer and all costs shall be the responsibility of the customer
- F. Modifications or relocations requested by the customer to District owned facilities serving customer-owned street light facilities shall be subject to approval from the District. The District will perform the requested modifications, provided the customer agrees to pay the cost.
- G. The District will isolate any trouble in the customer's system that has resulted in an outage or diminished light output. The District will make all necessary repairs up to the customer's point of service. Excavation or any major replacement of circuits, conduits, poles or fixtures owned by the customer shall not be the responsibility of the District.
- H. Vegetation management is the responsibility of the customer for installation of new lights or for maintaining existing lights.
- I. Regulations Governing the Sale of Electric Energy: Service under this rate schedule is subject to the District's Regulations Governing the Sale of Electric Energy.
